## From the Rector Fr. Doug Wasinger



The baptism of Jesus has a special place in my personal history with the Episcopal Church. In January of 2012 I arrived in Buffalo, Wyoming as the Priest-In-Charge, which meant I was assigned to the church with an agreement that I would serve for two years to see if we would be a good match. My family was still in Rawlins, Wyoming, about three hours away. It was a cold winter morning when I introduced myself to the congregation. The assigned reading for that Sunday was the Baptism of Our Lord Jesus, so I talked about new beginnings and how the baptism of Jesus was the opening of a new chapter in the long history of the relationship between Almighty God and the Hebrew people. That same night an individual who wanted to burn the church down to the ground broke into the building (he later was found not guilty due to reasons of insanity). A bond

was quickly established after that event for out of that horrible incident a strong and trusting relationship was established between the congregation and me.
